

# Senate Probers Look Into Hoffa's Election Funds

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11. — The Senate Rackets Committee is looking into the use of large amounts of union money in Jimmy Hoffa's election as new president of the Teamsters. This was confirmed today by Robert F. Kennedy, chief counsel of the committee. He said he may give details of the inquiry in a day or two.

Observers at the Teamster convention in Miami Beach last week were impressed by the fact that no expense was spared in the Hoffa campaign. This showed up in entertainment and refreshments in expensive hotels, and also in paraphernalia for Hoffa demonstrations in the convention hall.

Observers could get no light on where the money came from, but statements made by Hoffa in his recent appearance before the Senate committee indicated that it could have come out of dues paid by Teamster union members.

In response to questions he told the committee he would not hesitate to use union dues money to advance his own candidacy if he thought it necessary.

Questions on this subject followed the committee's disclosure that Hoffa had placed \$5000 from dues money paid by Teamster members in Michigan back of the campaign for re-election of Edward Crumback for the presidency of a Teamster local in Philadelphia. Crumback was running against another Teamster member.

## Patterson Query Plans Uncertain

The proposed court of inquiry hearing into the mysterious disappearance of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Patterson has made no progress beyond the talking stage. Garage Owner Cecil Ward, a friend of the Pattersons, said several weeks ago he would ask for the court of inquiry at the proper time. Ward said he wanted to give "everybody the benefit of the doubt" but he felt some official action should be taken soon.

District Attorney William E. Clayton and Investigator John Frizzell of the Sheriff's department said they have heard nothing from Ward.

The Pattersons, owners of the Patterson Photo Supply Co. here, dropped out of sight on March 5.

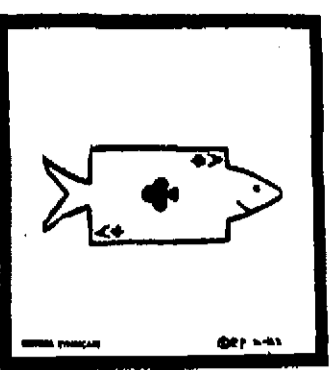
Sheriff W. O. Hicks put out an all-points missing persons bulletin on the Pattersons at the request of Ward, but thus far no officer nor anyone else has reported sighting them.

Investigator Frizzell has complained "some people who should know something about the missing couple are not talking." He said he found their attitude "intriguing."

A court of inquiry usually held before a justice of the peace can be called by any interested party, the district attorney said.

## Polio Shots Date Changed

Mrs. Hugh Steen, citizenship chairman for the El Paso High School Parent-Teacher's Assn., announces that a change in the date for the polio shots has been made. The previous date of Tuesday, Oct. 15, has been changed to Thursday, Oct. 17.

Shots will be given at El Paso High School at 9 a. m. Members of the P-TA will assist in administering these shots, given free to the El Paso high school students by the El Paso City-County Health Unit.

## Biggs Begins Classes

Fall semester classes were begun at Biggs Air Force Base. These off-duty, group-study classes are held on the base during evening hours and are entirely voluntary for those who wish to further their education. Teachers from El Paso are retained by the Biggs education section to instruct. There is no charge to Biggs personnel attending.

## \$58,000 More Taxes Paid

An additional \$58,000 in advance taxes was paid to the City today by two El Paso corporations.

The companies were Southern Union Gas Co., with a payment of \$50,000, and Gunning and Caspell, \$9000. That brings advance tax payments to almost \$700,000.

Mayor Raymond Telles recently directed subordinates to request companies for the advance payments in an effort to avoid an overdraft. According to tax and auditing officials, the overdraft is now a remote possibility.

During an overdraft, the City must borrow bank funds at three per cent for operating funds.

A car belonging to Jose Holguin of 701 South Hammett boulevard was stolen late yesterday, police said. The car was locked.

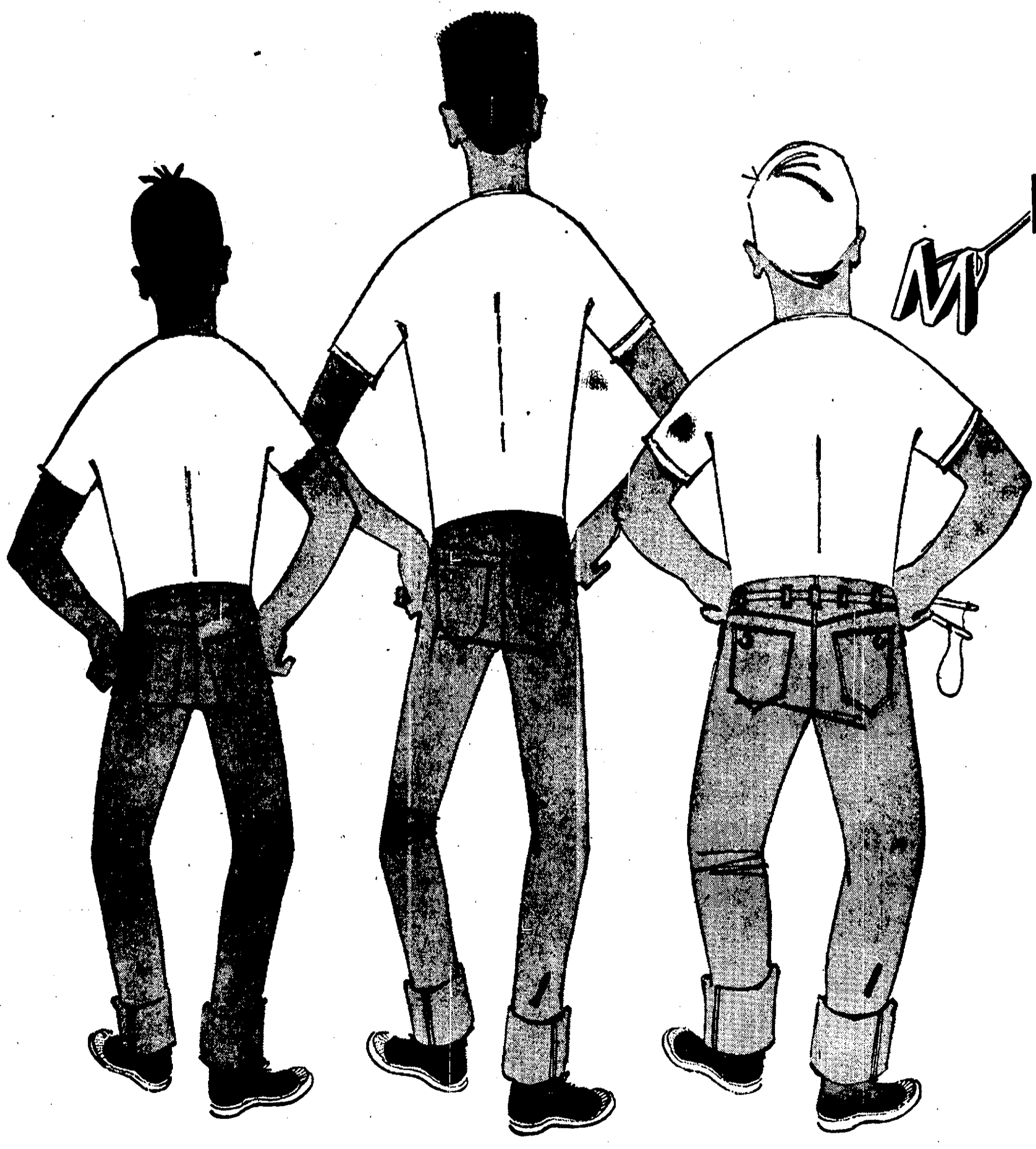
