Previous reports have said the message was signed "Pat." That is not true. The message bore the name "W. D. Patterson."

The Patterson mystery is no nearer solution today than it was when it started.

But the theory that the Pattersons are in secret communication with the managers of their business here is groundless.

All 13 members of the presidium were on the speakers stage with such visiting Communists as China's Mao Tse-Tung and Poland's Wladyslaw Gomulka.

Sputnik Commonwealth

Khrushchev called for America's space satellite and those of other nations to join Russia's in a "commonwealth of Sputniks" whirling about the earth.

"Such a commonwealth, such a competition would be much better than competition in the race to manufacture death-producing weapons," he said.

The state tally at that time gave: Retirement fund: 121,889 for; 45,521 against.

Pensions: 143,811 for; 25,412 against.

Water Bonds: 122,729 for; 44,536 against.

Robert Johnson, head of the election bureau, estimated 81 per cent of the total vote is already in. He said the vote was expected to be about 185,000, even less than the pre-election day estimate of 200,000.

Only counties where local elections were held showed normal voting. Brown county, which cast ballots on a beer election, reported excessively heavy voting. The county remained dry.

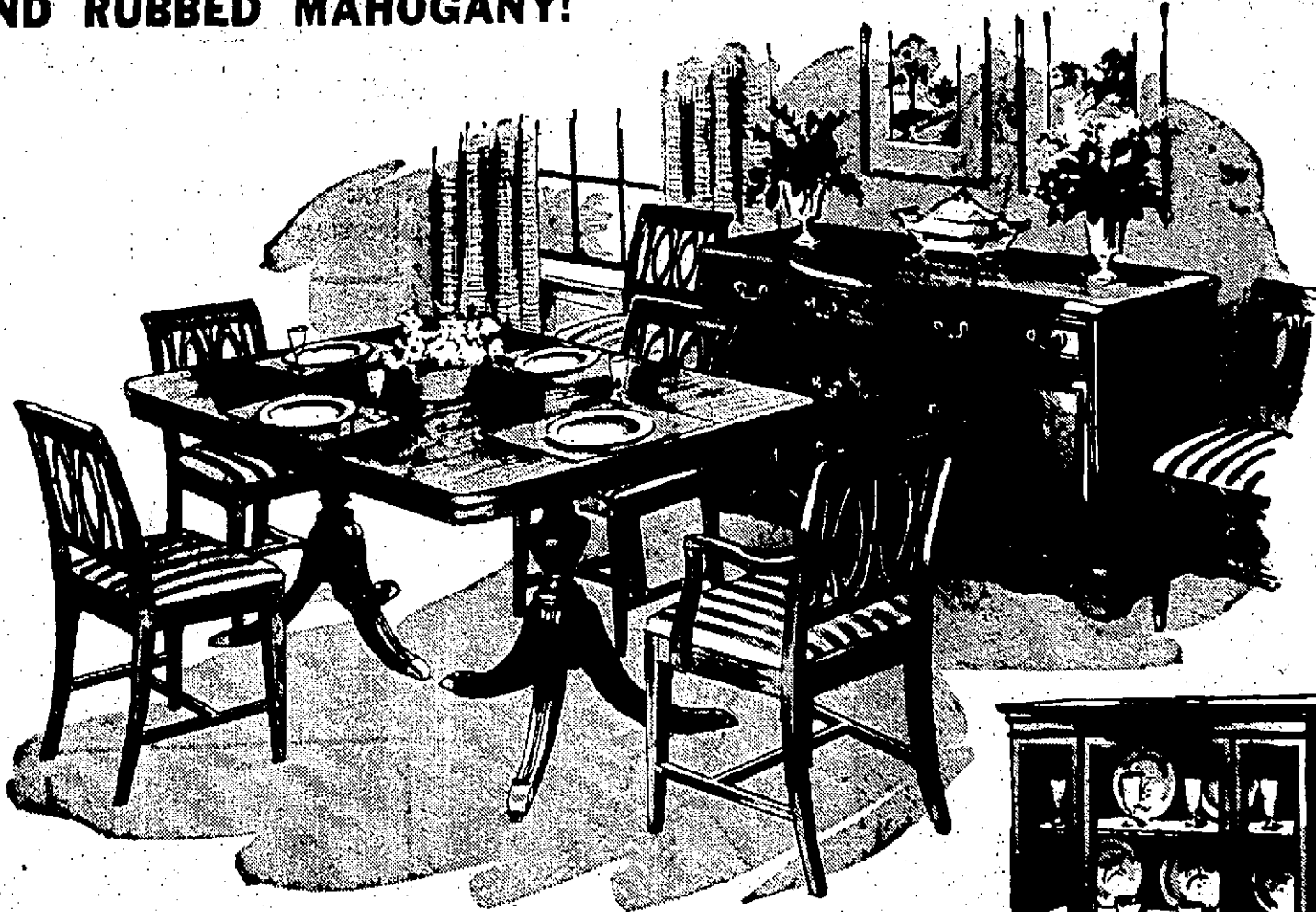

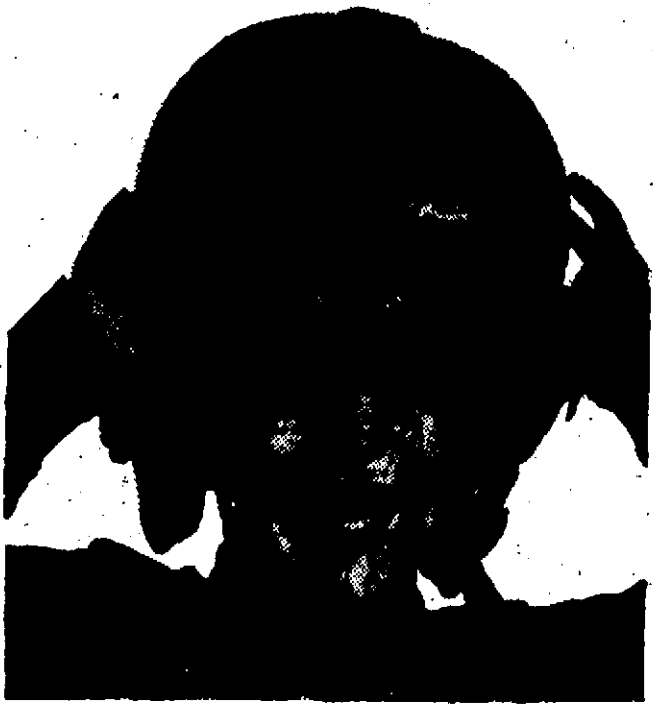

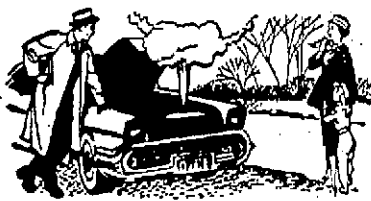
