

Officials Leave For Water Meet

A delegation of officials including spokesmen for the City, Public Service Board and Lower Valley Water District left El Paso today for Dallas where they will meet with representatives of the bondholders of the Lower Valley Water District.

Mayor Telles and City Attorney Travis White represent the City there. Harlan H. Hugg, general manager of the Public Service Board, and PSB Board Chairman Paul Harvey will arrive there late today or tomorrow morning. Other PSB representatives are Attorney Morris Galatzan and Accountant Murray Manning. Chairman Rod Davenport represents the Lower Valley Water District.

Mayor Pro Tem Ralph Seitsinger was at the Mayor's desk today handling routine City business. Some of the delegates will return as early as tomorrow evening, after tomorrow's sessions. But Mayor Telles will meet Airport Manager James Gagnon in Fort Worth Wednesday. The two plan a lengthy conference with Civil Aeronautics Administration officials on the extensive airport remodeling project now in progress. CAA will pay half of the \$1 million-plus project.

Humane Unit May Give Free Shots

Humane Society officials have under consideration a plan whereby the Society would hire a full-time veterinarian to give free rabies immunization shots to dogs throughout the City.

Under such a plan the present City fee of \$2 for a dog license might be continued or might rise to \$3. The license would be issued only to inoculated dogs but the anti-rabies shot would be free, according to Gordon Hale, Humane Society manager.

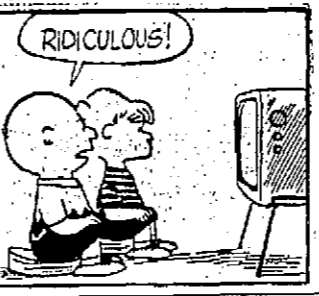
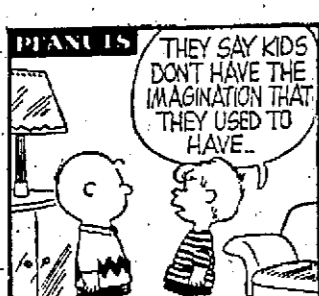
Present Costs
It now costs \$2 license fee plus \$3 paid to a veterinarian for the rabies shot.

Total yearly cost to each owner would therefore drop from the present \$5 to a total of \$2 or at the most \$3.

Mr. Hale said the plan might mean the full-time veterinarian would be available to administer distemper and hepatitis shots to dogs released for adoption by the Humane Society. In addition, the staff veterinarian could spray all the female dogs released for adoption. This policy already is in effect by the Humane Society as a control measure, but the Society must now pay private veterinarians who do Humane Society work.

Rabies Emergency
The full time Humane Society veterinarian was proposed after private veterinarians declined to reduce their \$3 fee. Officials have warned that El Paso has a rabies emergency and that strong control measures must be taken. A total of 301 confirmed cases of rabies among animals were discovered in El Paso in the past four years.

Details of the proposed plan still are being worked out, Mr. Hale said. It has not been formally presented to City officials.



Youth Shot Trying To Escape Arrest

A 17-year-old youth is in fair condition today at El Paso General Hospital after undergoing surgery for removal of a police bullet from his left shoulder.

Carlos Marshall of 2411 Pittsburgh street was shot by police after he failed to heed a command to halt.

Marshall and a companion, Salvador Gonzales, 19, of 501 East Arizona street, were fired at by officers yesterday in a chase along Copia street.

The pair allegedly stole an auto at Ninth and Santa Fe streets. Radio Patrol Officers M. Ayers and Sammy Haddad spotted the youths at Copia and Montana streets.

The youths ignored the officers and sped away on Copia street. Two shots fired in the air brought no response, but bullet-punctured tires halted the auto in the 2800 block of Tyler street.

The youths abandoned the auto and tried to escape on foot. Officer Ayers brought down Marshall with a bullet through the shoulder. Gonzales surrendered after Officer Haddad fired once between the youths' legs.

John W. Cain Jr. of 210 Cargill road, owner of the vehicle, appeared at the police station a short while later to report the theft.

made a plaintiff along with the creditors in the receivership suit.

Defendants are the missing Pattersons, D. G. Kirkland, and the El Paso National Bank. Herbert Roth was named temporary receiver.

Cited by Publication
Mr. Kirkland, an owner of Duffy Photo Service who resides in Lubbock, was named manager of the Pattersons' business in a telegram sent from Dallas March 15, 1957. The telegram was signed "Pat."

The telegram, which Pattersons' business associates and attorney say they believe was authentic, was the last word received from the missing pair.

The El Paso National Bank brought on the receivership by informing the Patterson photo store it could no longer accept deposits and withdrawals. The suit by creditors followed.

The Pattersons, as defendants in the receivership suit, were cited by publication. The legal notice read: "You are commanded to appear by filing a written answer to the plaintiffs' petition at or before 10 o'clock a. m. of the first Monday after the expiration of 42 days from the date of issuance of this citation, the same being Monday the 10th day of March . . ."

At 10 a. m. today the Pattersons had not appeared. The mystery of their whereabouts was as deep as ever.

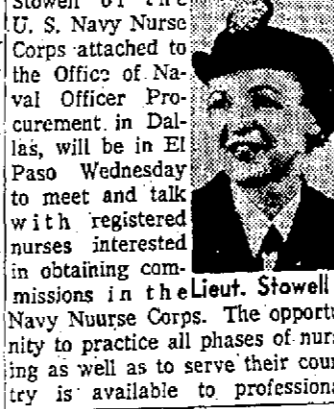

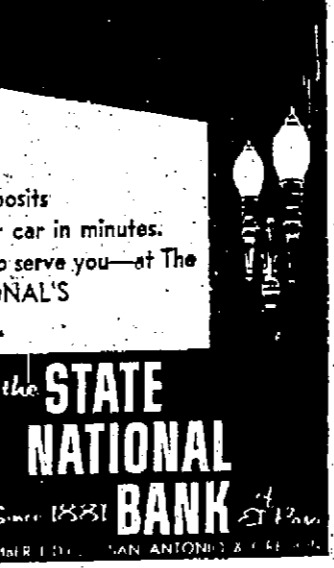
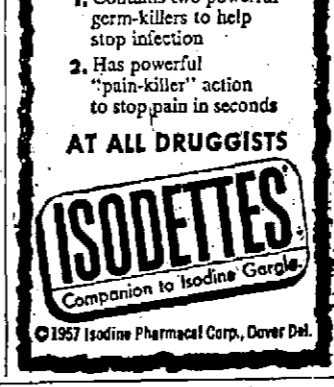
