**Postal Rate Boost Signed By Eisenhower**

 WASHINGTON, May 28. — The four-cent stamp for local and out-of-town letters definitely goes into effect Aug. 1.  
 President Eisenhower signed a bill yesterday which raises both postal rates and wages. First class letters will be increased from 3 to 4 cents. Air Mail will be hiked from 6 to 7 cents. It will be the first increase in first-class mail rates since 1932.

**Outweighs Objections**  
 The President said the bill's "public interest" features outweighed its objectionable provisions. But he said several provisions caused him "grave concern," including one which would assess the treasury for an "excessive amount of postal services costs" instead of levying them against users of the mails.

He said these postal services would cost about \$100 million a year and "logically and equitably" should have been financed through proper rates of postage.  
 Other presidential objections were "failure of the Congress to provide sufficient revenues to meet the full cost of operating the postal service," and a salary structure for postal workers which raises pay of lower bracket employees but no increase at all.

**One Penny Boost**  
 The penny boost in letter charge is the main item in the rate increase package, biggest in history and expected to bring in an extra \$550 million annually when all its provisions take effect.  
 The new law also gives pay raises of \$265 million a year to 520,000 postal workers, retroactive to last Jan. 1.

**Stolen Money Orders Cashed at Store**

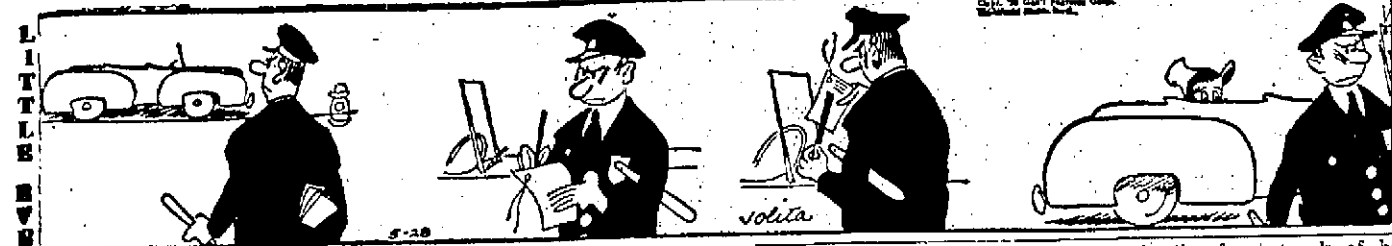
The Federal Bureau of Investigation today entered the investigation of 41 money order blanks stolen in Dallas, some of which were passed off here.

After the money order was cashed, Mr. Phifer heard from the El Paso Retail Credit Bureau that 41 money orders had been stolen from the Bondified Money Order Co. in Dallas. The numbers of the stolen blanks ranged from AD 660009 to AD 660050.

night, and keep a baffling silence for the last 15 months?  
 Mrs. Werle, sister of the missing man, offered her own explanation. "Pat needed a challenge," she said. "He was a great salesman. As he got older perhaps he wanted to know if he could do the things he had done when younger. Perhaps he and Margaret wanted to prove to themselves that they still had the ability to sell."

That, she added, would explain why Mr. and Mrs. Patterson have drawn no money from their El Paso business since they left.

**He Left Home**  
 The elder Patterson said: "Pat left home at an early age and did direct selling all over the country. He was known everywhere. He got stuck in El Paso by the war, in the early 1940s, and was a street photographer. Then he built up the photo supply business—had a phenomenal success."  
 "Pat liked success. But once he had success, he tired of it."

Mr. Patterson said he believes that a telegram received March 15, 1957, by Accountant Herbert Roth was authentic and from his son. The telegram, sent from Dallas and signed "Pat," gave instructions on running the El Paso photo business, renting the house and disposing of certain property.

Mr. Patterson today visited his son's house at 3000 Piedmont avenue. It was from this house that the Pattersons vanished, some time during the night of March 5-6.

**Met and Married**  
 Mr. Patterson said his son was born July 23, 1904, in Chicago, and left home in his teens, traveling

about the country as a salesman but never, despite some reports, as a carnival follower. He said Pat seldom wrote, but dropped in on the family in Chicago from time to time. At one time, the father said, Pat established a nice car painting business in Chicago, but got restless and left it.

While traveling Pat met and married Margaret (TINE) Kiefer, an attractive hostess at the Vendome Hotel in Evansville, Ind., in the early 1930s. They traveled together, and once came to Chicago, both of them "selling," Mr. Patterson said.

Mr. Werle joined his wife and her father in stating a belief that the missing couple are safe and will return. "I admired Pat a great deal as a person," Mr. Werle said. "And when Pat was around you could expect the unusual."
